Pass Marks: A candidate has to secure 30% of the full marks in each of theoretical, practical/tutorial component of a course (excluding internal assessment marks), as well as in the course total (including internal assessment marks) in order to earn credit in the course.

Grace Marks: If a candidate fails in a course due to deficit of not more than one mark either in theoretical or in practical/tutorial component or in the course total, then that deficit mark is awarded to the candidate and such deficit mark is shown in the Grade Sheet with + sign.

Credit: All CC/GE/DSE courses have 6 credits each. Courses having tutorial component have 5 credits in theoretical component and 1 credit in tutorial component; courses having practical component have 4 credits in theoretical component and 2 credits in practical component. All AEC/SEC/LCC courses have 2 credits each.

Grade, Grade Point & Credit Point:

Marks obtained by a candidate in a course have been converted to Letter Grade as per the 10-point grading system given below.

Credit Point: Credit point of a course is calculated only if a candidate has passed in that course and has earned the credit. After addition of Internal assessment marks to theoretical and practical/tutorial portion in proportion of the full marks of theoretical and practical/tutorial components, the marks are converted to grade points using the formula $[3.0 + ((P-30) \times 0.1)]$, where the candidate secures P% of marks and $P \geq 30$. Grade points are then multiplied by respective credits to calculate credit points of theoretical and practical/tutorial components. Course credit points are total of theoretical credit point and practical/tutorial credit points.

Credit point will not be generated for course having status 'F' or 'AB' as well as 'EC' or 'DB'.

Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA): For each Semester (1-6) SGPA is calculated by using the following formula provided the candidate has passed in all courses of the Semesters.

$SGPA = \frac{\text{Sum of Credit Points of all Courses in the Semester}}{\text{Sum of Credits of all Courses in the Semester}}$ i.e. $[\sum (P_i \times C_i) / \sum C_i]$; (where P_i = numerical grade point obtained in the i^{th} course, C_i = credit in the corresponding course, $i=1$ to n , n = number of courses)

Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA): At the final Semester examination CGPA is calculated by the formula given below provided the candidate has passed in all 6 Semesters.

$CGPA = \frac{\text{Sum of Credit Points of all Courses in all 6 Semesters}}{\text{Sum of Credits of all Courses in all 6 Semesters}}$ i.e. $[\sum (SGPA_i \times C_i) / \sum C_i]$; (where $SGPA_i$ is the SGPA of the i^{th} Semester ($i=1$ to 6) and C_i is the total credit of the i^{th} Semester).

Both SGPA and CGPA are rounded off to the third place of the decimal.

Degree: 1. A candidate pursuing Honours Course of study is awarded as below:

- Honours Degree is awarded if a candidate passed in all 6 Semesters and secures a minimum of CGPA 4.000. Corresponding Letter Grade is awarded as per the table given below.
- General Degree is awarded if a candidate passed in all 6 Semesters and secures a minimum of CGPA 3.000 but less than 4.000 and corresponding letter Grade is awarded.

2. A candidate pursuing General Course of study is awarded General Degree, if passed in all 6 Semesters and secures a minimum of CGPA 3.000. Corresponding Letter Grade is awarded as per the table given below.

3. A candidate pursuing Major Course of study is awarded Major Degree if passed in all 6 Semesters and secures a minimum of CGPA 3.000. Corresponding Letter Grade is awarded as per the table given below.
