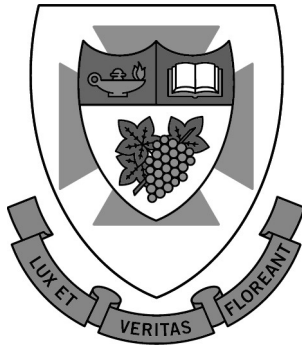

UNDERGRADUATE AND GRADUATE EXPLANATORY NOTES

History

The University of Winnipeg was established in July 1967, when the Province of Manitoba granted full university status to United College. Prior to July 1967, United College was affiliated with the University of Manitoba. The two founding colleges, Manitoba College (founded in 1871) and Wesley College (founded in 1888), were united in 1926 and functioned as "The United Colleges." In 1938 a provincial charter officially amalgamated them as United College.

The University is a member of Universities Canada, The Association of Commonwealth Universities, and the International Association of Universities. Its Faculty of Theology is accredited by the Association of Theological Schools in the United States and Canada.

Concord College, associated with The University of Winnipeg since 1970, and now a part of the Canadian Mennonite University, served as the University's Music Department. New students were accepted into this music program only until September 2001.

Graduate Studies at the University of Winnipeg have included degrees in Theology since the University's inception. In July 1976, Joint Master's Programs in Arts were initiated with the University of Manitoba, followed by Public Affairs (later Public Administration) in 1977. The Marriage and Family Therapy degree was first awarded in 1992. In July 2007, the University began offering stand-alone Master's degrees.

Between May 1, 1997 and August 31, 2003, the A- was not in use. Effective September 1, 2003, the grade of A- was reintroduced. The grade points assigned to a grade of A were readjusted to 4.25.

Cumulative GPA

The grade point average is calculated on all credit hours attempted. It is calculated by dividing the weighted grade points by the total number of credit hours passed and credit hours failed. The number of hours in "Standing" courses will not be included in this calculation.

For Undergraduate, in the case of repeated courses, prior to Spring 2009, both grades and the number of credit hours in both courses will be included in the calculation. Beginning Spring 2009 repeated courses will count only the best grade out of any passed attempts, however, all attempts will appear on the transcript. Failed repeated courses are not marked as repeats and will be counted in the cumulative GPA.

For Graduate, in the case of a repeated course, both grades and the number of credit hours in both courses will be included in the calculation.

Academic Terms

The University of Winnipeg offers courses in 4 terms. The Fall and Winter terms each have 12 weeks of classes and 2 weeks of evaluation. A 6 credit hour course is normally taught over 2 terms and a 3 credit hour course over one term. Some courses may also be taught

Course Weight and Value

The University designates the value of its courses in credit hours.

- Full courses are 6 credit hours and consist of 3 lecture hours per week over the Fall/Winter term: Equivalent to 2 semesters or 3 quarters.
 - Half courses are 3 credit hours and consist of 3 lecture hours per week over the Fall term or the Winter term.
- Courses with credit hours other than 3 and 6 will be designated accordingly.
