The records of the California Board of Accountancy (CBA) indicate that you have successfully passed all four sections of the Uniform Certified Public Accountant Examination (CPA Exam). The scores awarded on the CPA Exam were those reported by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants and adopted, unchanged, by the CBA. Your scores do not expire.

It is important for you to know that passing the CPA Exam is only the first step in the CPA licensure process. In addition to meeting the licensing educational requirements, the below steps must be completed.

- If you completed additional education since qualifying for the CPA Exam that should be considered for licensure purposes, request transcripts and/or foreign evaluations to be mailed directly to the CBA from the institution.
- Request that your supervisor complete and mail your *Certificates of Experience* directly to the CBA. The CBA cannot accept *Certificates of Experience* submitted by an applicant.
- Complete the Professional Ethics for Certified Public Accountants examination through the California CPA Education Foundation, www.educationfoundation.org, with a score of 90% or higher.
- Submit fingerprints for the purpose of conducting a criminal history record check with the Department of Justice and the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
- Complete and submit the Initial CPA License Application and Criminal Conviction Disclosure form.
